

It's a great way to reflect on the program's case weight and current caseload. I found the prompts and definitions very helpful. No improvements suggested, I thought it was comprehensive and adequate for the program involvement. Assess definition for 'target children'. Nickey Stamey – MYHF: The new template allowed me to learn as the program manager the program areas I need to be more conscientious about and to elicit feedback from program staff. The questions asked and data captured worked well. Formatting could be improved. Perhaps have all the numerical data fields on one page and then have a separate page for	Make formatting changes to group all numerical data fields within the same section and all narratives within same section.  Consider adding new fields to HFA report for HV completion rates.  Definition for 'target children' was revised on HFA data definitions document. The NFP document was defining it slightly differently and so it was not altered.

narrative data. Jan Williams / Nina Kane – HFD: Nina: The new fields are helpful because they show a more complete picture of what's going on in the program than they had previously. The trajectory between referral to enrollment to active client to graduation is much clearer now when I look at the data. Definitions seem clear and helpful. Jan: As a supervisor, it's much easier to understand the monthly data now that the discharge column has been added. I like the layout of the form much better---I can read it without squinting. The narrative questions provided good discussion amongst the team, and I actually learned some things about the team that I didn't know. We'll continue doing the narrative questions as a group. The definitions seemed clear to me. It also is very helpful to have the table built into the form that automatically computes caseload weight. The form makes me be faithful to calculating program case weight each month, where as previously it just seemed like such a daunting task. Ann Stroupe – Gaston NFP:

I do like having the new fields to look at regarding referrals. This

			helps me when I am having 1:1 with my staff. I do find the new questions helpful. It gives the opportunity to present problems for consultant. It also helps make me aware of things that I may be falling behind in and need to improve.
