With funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Office for State, Tribal, Local, & Territorial Support, the National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO) is pleased to announce a funding opportunity for local health departments (LHDs) to engage in accreditation readiness activities. The 2013-2014 Accreditation Support Initiative awards are intended to stimulate QI and promote LHD readiness to seek voluntary national accreditation through PHAB.

Application requirements and full details about the ASI opportunity are provided in the Request for Applications and the application reference document. Applications, via the online submission form, are due Wednesday, November 13, 2013.
